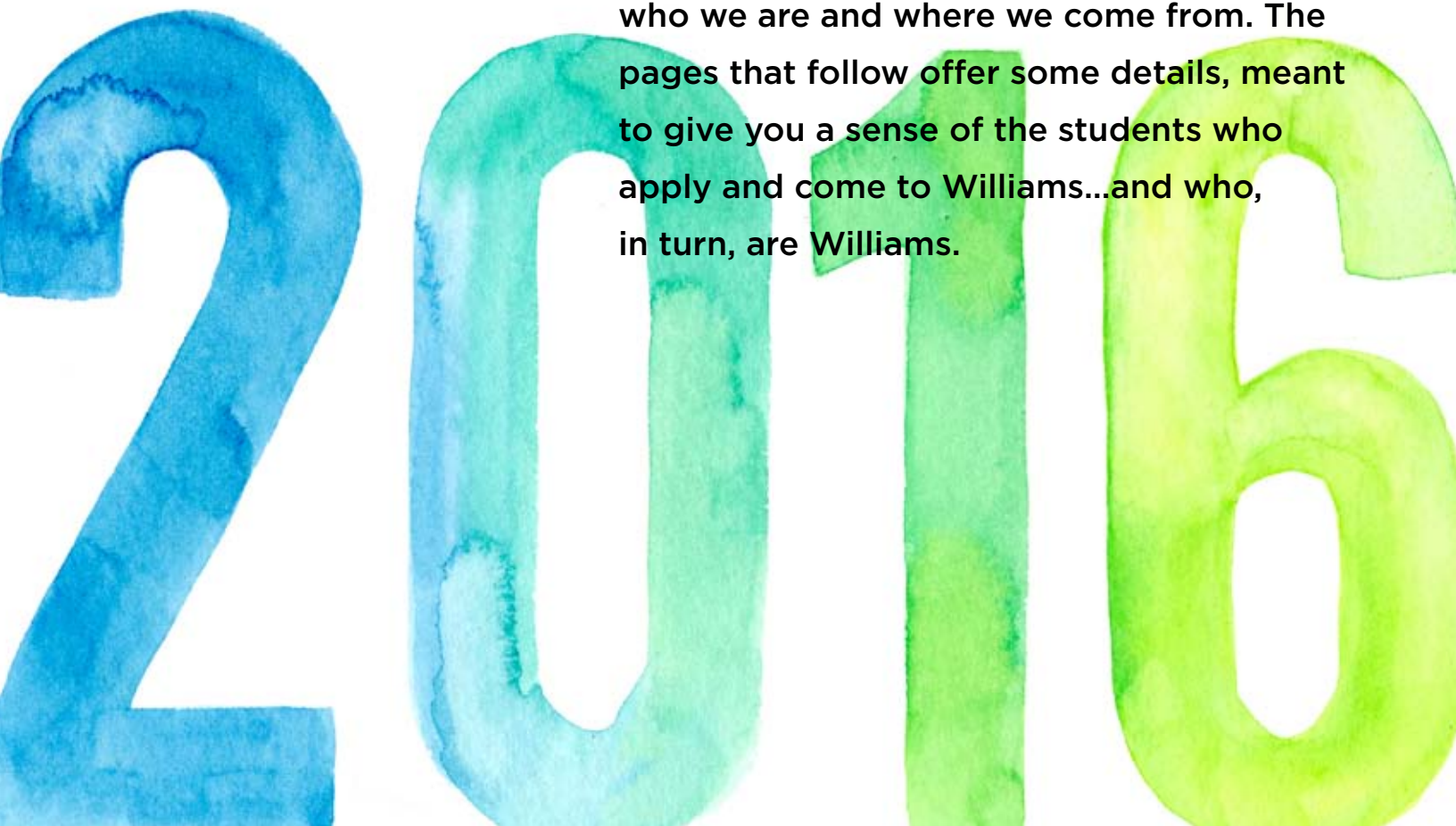

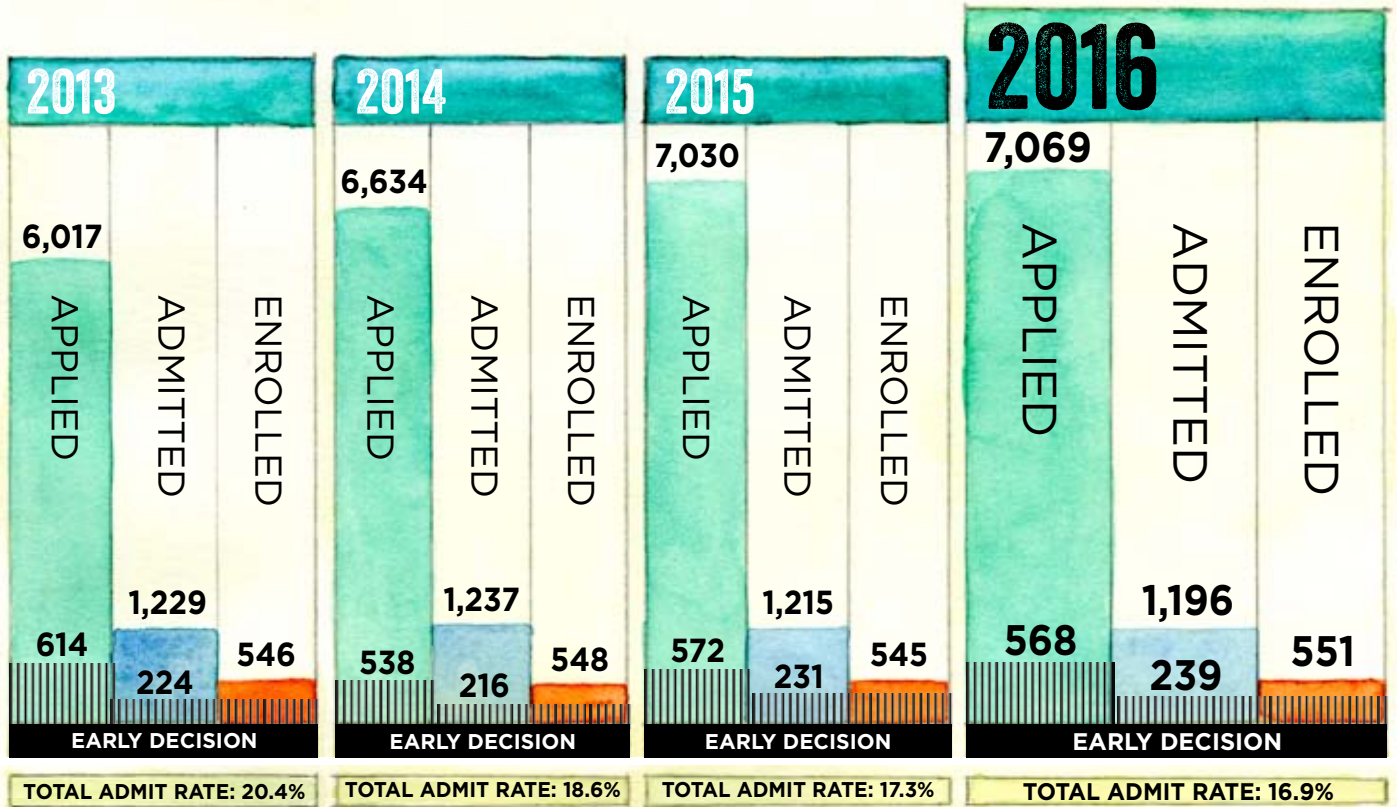
Student Profile

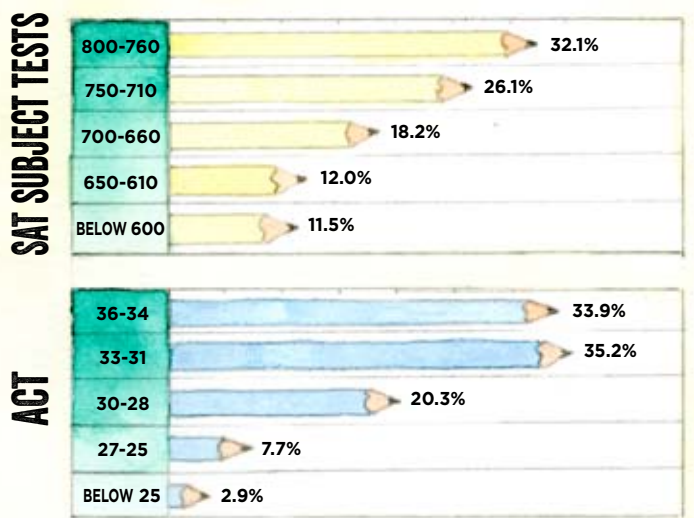
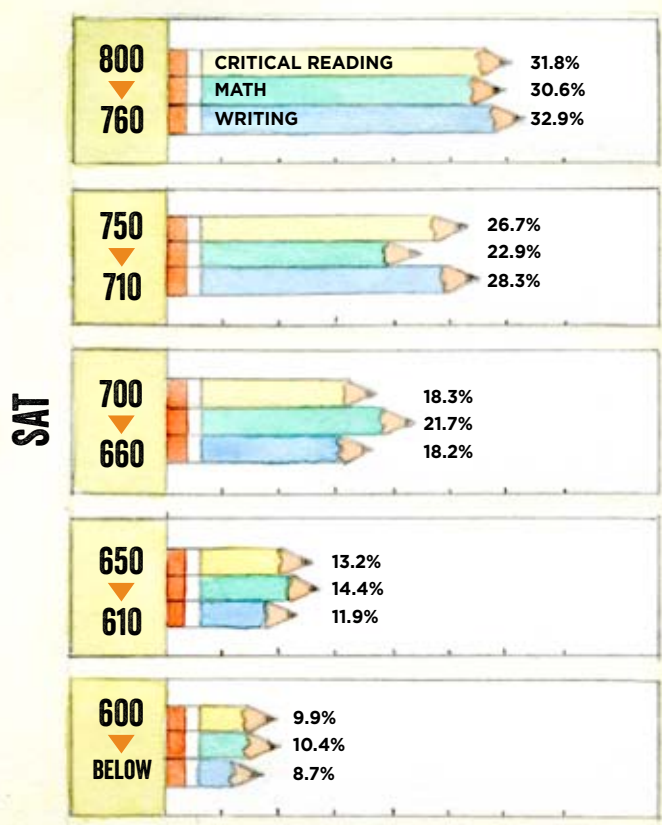

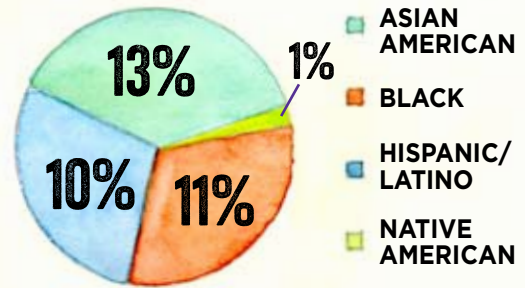

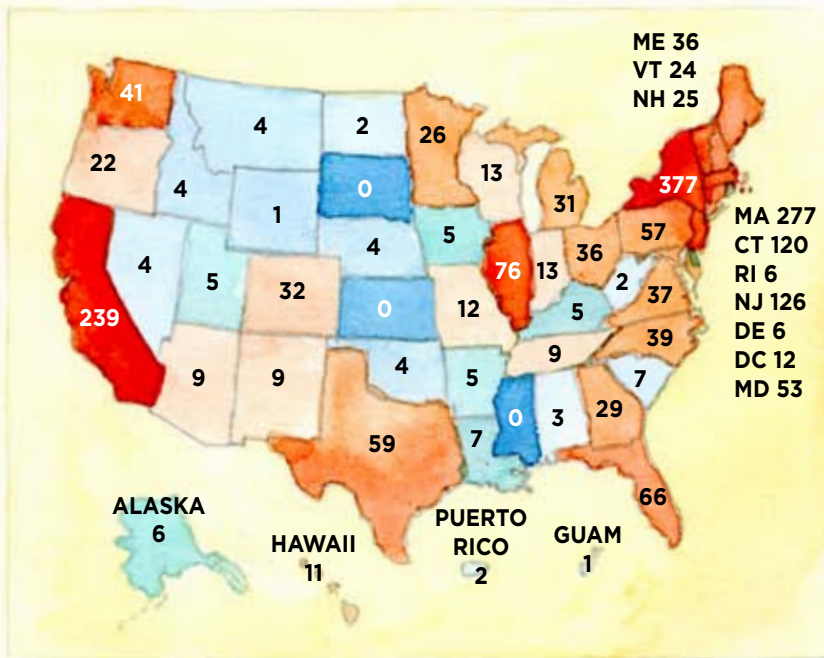

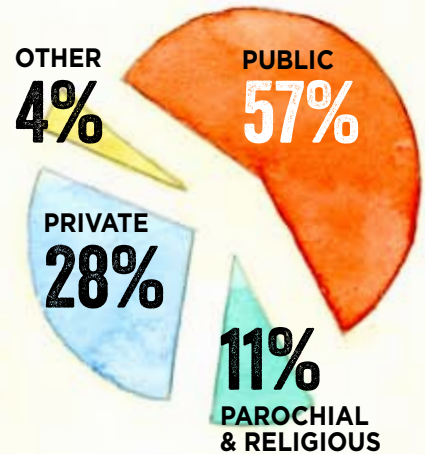

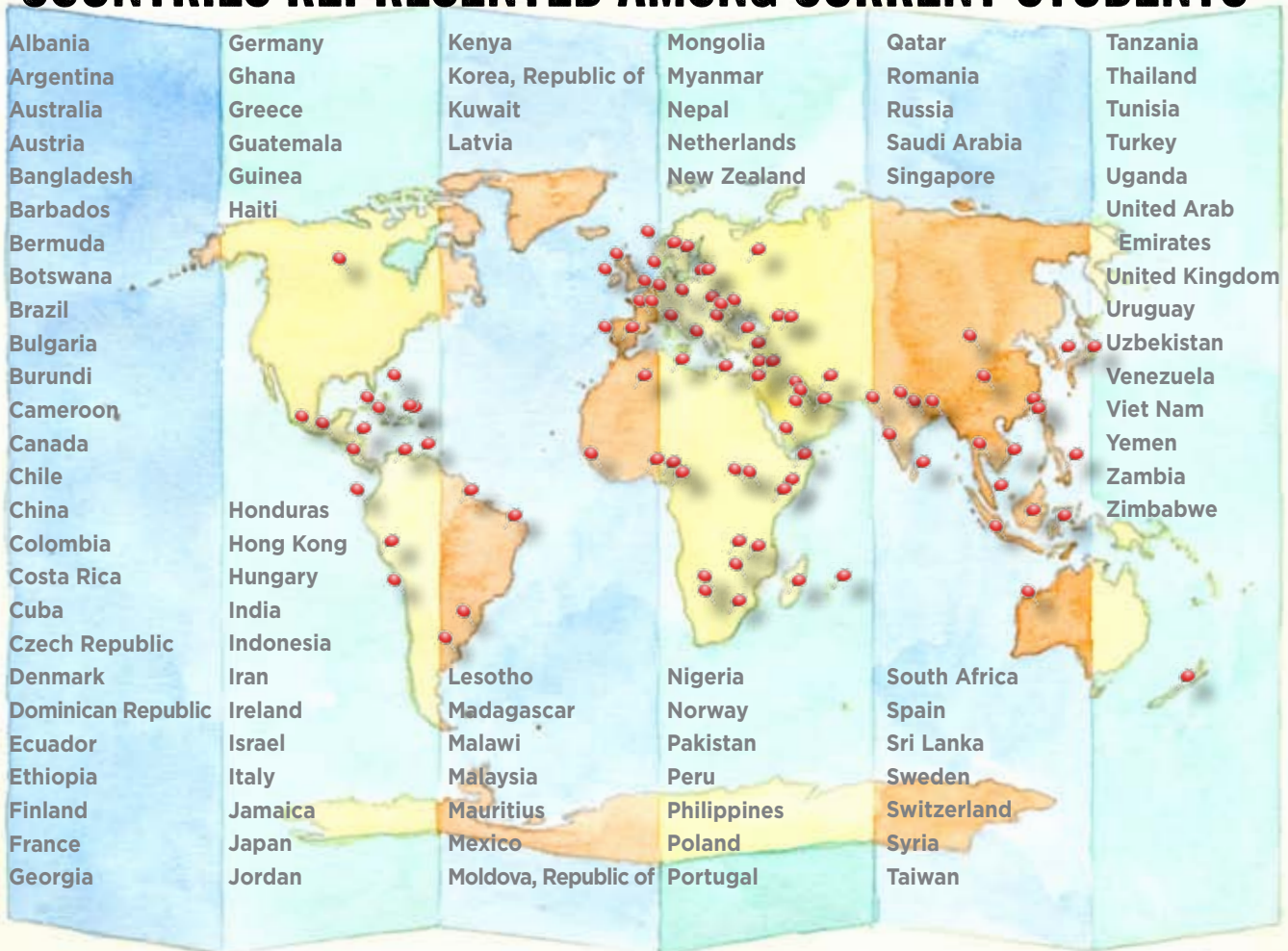


HIGH SCHOOL ORIGINS

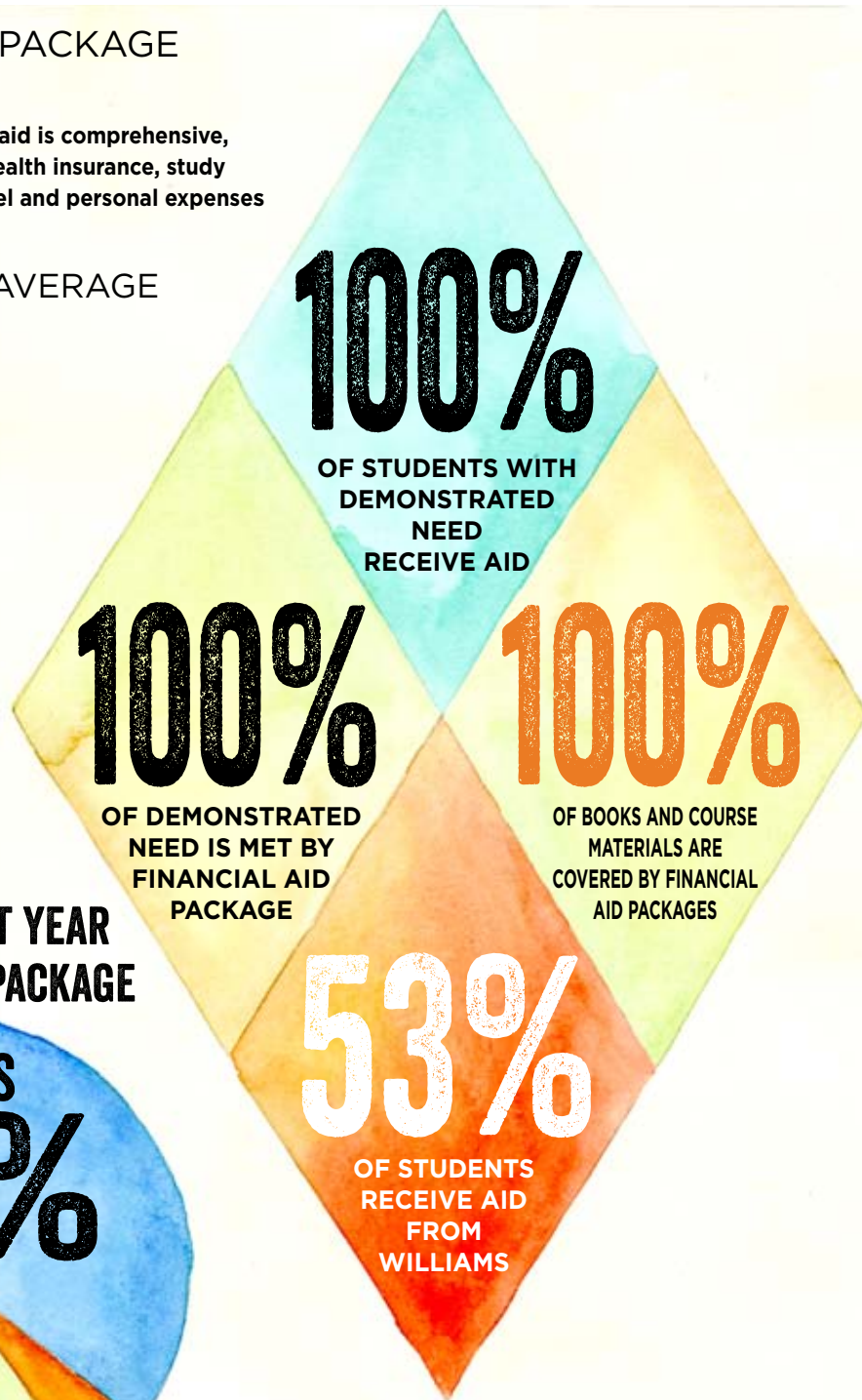
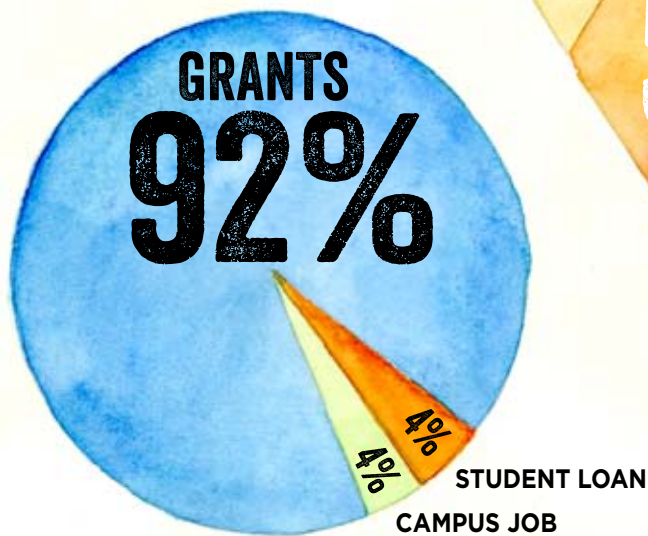
RANGE OF FINANCIAL AID AWARDS TO INDIVIDUALS
